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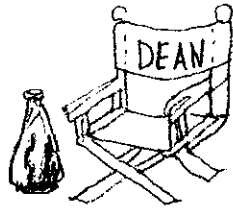

FROM THE DEAN'S CHAIR



Once again the advent of a new school year signals a renewal of our professional activities. The Bicentennial year can, and should go down as one that will be remembered as the year of "Media in Minnesota." In retrospect, we can look back over the years of both AVCAM and MASL with a great deal of pride in knowing that leaders and membership in both organizations have shown good state and national leadership in developing high quality programs for Minnesota. We should not lose sight of the achievements of both of these fine organizations, but neither should we let past achievements become stumbling blocks for what can be even greater achievements in the years ahead. There is an inherent danger in saying, "Look At What We've Done," instead of saying with determined enthusiasm, "Look At What We Can Do!"

And so as each and every individual begins another school year, it should be a year of determined effort with goals and objectives that reach out beyond the mediocre; it should be a year of cooperative effort to make "Media in Minnesota" an integral part of an outstanding educational system; and it should be a year of involvement in professional associations that will enable media programs to show leadership within and outside the State of Minnesota. To this end, the Task Force of Merger of AVCAM and MASL has worked to achieve solidarity in one united professional organization, an organization that can look back at past achievements of two groups of dedicated educators and use those achievements to build an even greater organization to serve even better the youth of our state. It is only as an individual, however, participating in the democratic process by expressing our feelings, by casting our ballots, and by participating with our attendance at professional meetings only in that way we will be able to move ahead in a unified professional organization as the individual members choose.

ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES AT SCSU

Readers might take note of administrative changes in the organizational hierarchy at SCSU. Dr. David Johnson has accepted the position of Vice-President for Academic Affairs, replacing Dr. Lowell Gillett who served for one year as a temporary replacement for the resigned Dr. John Tomlinson. Dr. Gillett will resume his duties as Graduate Dean and Dr. Vern Lude-
mañ, Acting Graduate Dean last, will once again be the Associate Graduate Dean. Dr. Louise Johnson has been appointed to the position of Dean of Liberal Arts and Sciences effective July 1, 1976. Dr. Owen Hagen is the new Associate Dean of Continuing Education.

ACCREDITATION VISITS SCHEDULED

The past academic year was devoted to self-studies in anticipation of scheduled accreditation visits for the 1976-77 academic year. Visits by the North Central Association, the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, and the State Department of Education are all scheduled for the latter part of this academic year, all of which means that the members of the Learning Resources Services/Department of Library and Audiovisual Education will be much involved in both last minute preparations and in the visits themselves.



Faculty Changes

Several significant changes have occurred on the staff of Learning Resources and the Department of Library and Audiovisual Education. Dr. John BERLING has assumed the duties of Assistant Dean, a position vacated when Dr. David RYDBERG took over the position of Leader of Technical Services. Dr. RYDBERG will be

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devoting much time to the exploration and implementation of automation in various technical service functions.

Judy KINDERSKI and Ford JENSEN, both from the Reference Section of Public Services, have taken a year's leave of absence to further their education. Judy is off to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, while Ford has returned to the University of Arizona to continue his work. Employed as replacements were two former assistants, Luther ROTTO and Phyllis LA-CROIX. They are on temporary contract for the 1976-77 year.



WELL ATTENDED

Many professional and commercial members attended the annual Upper Mississippi Media Conference held in St. Cloud on May 5, 6, and 7. The theme of the conference was "Spirit of 76 - Merger." Keynote speaker for the conference was Howard Hitchens, Executive Director of AECT, and Bob Lurtsema was the featured speaker primary evening session on Thursday. Featured on the program were Pat CHRISTIANSON of the Great River Regional on Storytelling, Norman CLARKE of SCSU on Local History, Jean PETERSON of Morris on Periodicals David TUCHSCHERER of Brainerd on Indian and Mexican American Materials, Dennis FIELDS of SCSU on Practical Research Ideas, Richard LEDIN of Eden Prairie on Curriculum Development, Tom TRIPET and Helen STUB on Merger, Ford JENSEN on Free and Inexpensive Materials, Boyd PURDOM on Non-Verbal Communication and John BERLING of SCSU on Instructional Media and the Slow Learner. The closing session featured Dr. Robert WICK, Distinguished Professor at SCSU on "A Focus on Libraries."

AVCAM and MASL will vote on merger of the two organizations into the Minnesota Educational Media Organization this fall. AVCAM members will vote on changing the by-laws and articles of incorporation to change the name and organization while MASL members will vote to discontinue as an organization and to join the new organization. MASL will use a mail ballot. AVCAM will vote at the October 22 meeting at South Hennepin Vocational Technical School. In order to allow members to vote who cannot be at the meeting, AVCAM is sending out proxy ballots which allow a vote to be cast.

Please, if you are a member of either organization or both, take this opportunity to vote and register your desire about the formation of a new media organization.

DEPARTMENTAL CERTIFICATION AND

DEGREE PROGRAMS

In order to be of service to prospective students or to those professionals who wish to upgrade certification or work toward a degree, a brief review of the various programs follows.

Audiovisual Coordinator

The planning committee for the conference consisted of Gary GERMUNDSON, Harlan JENSEN, Sheri PRETZER, Jan SORELL, Wayne SCHOEFTER, and Lawrence SMELSER.

This program is available only on the undergraduate level as part of the expanded 36-hour media minor. Because of the minimal require-

ments for this certification, the department no longer recommends that students take this program on the graduate level, but it might be noted that the State Department will still certify those who have completed the required courses.

School Librarian

Certification as a school librarian is still available on both the undergraduate and graduate level. Persons who have completed requirements for a bachelor's degree must take the courses on the graduate level. On the undergraduate level, the program is a 26-hour minor (with an IM 468 prerequisite); on the graduate level, the program is available with a 28-hour graduate course of study.

Audiovisual Director

This endorsement requires two years of classroom teaching experience and is available only on the graduate level, either through a degree program or as part of a non-degree program as a special student. It builds on to the courses required for the audiovisual coordinator's certificate in the media area, but also requires curriculum courses and a course in educational administration.

Media Generalist

The certificate is available on both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The student who completes the 36-hour minor meets all of the qualifications except the required two years of experience. After two years of experience, application may be made for the media generalist endorsement. Course work on the graduate level may be taken either as part of a degree program or as a special student, and all previous coursework is evaluated in light of the SCSU certification program. Two years of experience is required for the endorsement.

Media Supervisor

This endorsement certificate is available only on the graduate level. It requires three or more years of successful experience in the area of media. It also requires 18 credits of study beyond a masters degree. This program may be taken as part of the Educational Specialist Degree (6th year) or may be taken as a special student. It is required as part of the Ed.S. degree for all persons with teacher certification.

Masters Degree in IM

Programs are available to holders of a baccalaureate degree, either a B.A. or a B.S. Two separate programs exist, with the program for the non-teaching degree designed to support persons who have no intention seeking certification or certification endorsement to a teaching degree. Program two is designed to meet the needs of those with a teaching degree seeking certification endorsement.

Specialist Degree (Ed.S.)

The Specialist Degree program (6th year) is available to (1) those who have completed a master's degree with a major in some area of media (library and audiovisual education), (2) those who have completed a minimum of 45 graduate credits in some area of media but who have not completed the master's degree yet are eligible, or (3) those who have a master's degree in another area. Each program will be designed to meet the individual's needs and interests.

More detailed information on all of these programs can be obtained by looking through the Graduate Bulletin or by writing for information or by making an appointment with a member of the faculty of the Department of Library and Audiovisual Education at St. Cloud State University.

COURSES OF INTEREST TO

MEDIA SPECIALISTS

The series of short courses offered by the Department of Library and Audiovisual Education during the summer sessions were well attended and from all indications quite successful. It is anticipated that similar courses will again be held next summer. Among those offered were Contemporary Materials, Government Documents, Media Person and Local History, and Equipment Maintenance and Repair.

Media for Teachers still has a continuing interest for particular districts and/or a number of district in consortium. If anyone has an interest in such a course for any district, please contact Dr. Lawrence Smelser, Department of Library and Audiovisual Education. Meanwhile a comprehensive listing of courses is available on campus for interested media personnel and teachers, and hopefully, some classes will be offered off-campus during the winter.

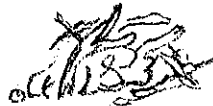

STICKS AND STONES



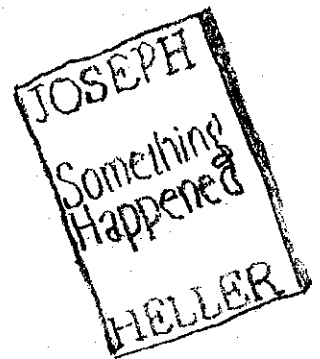
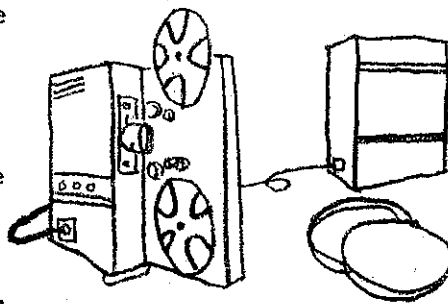
