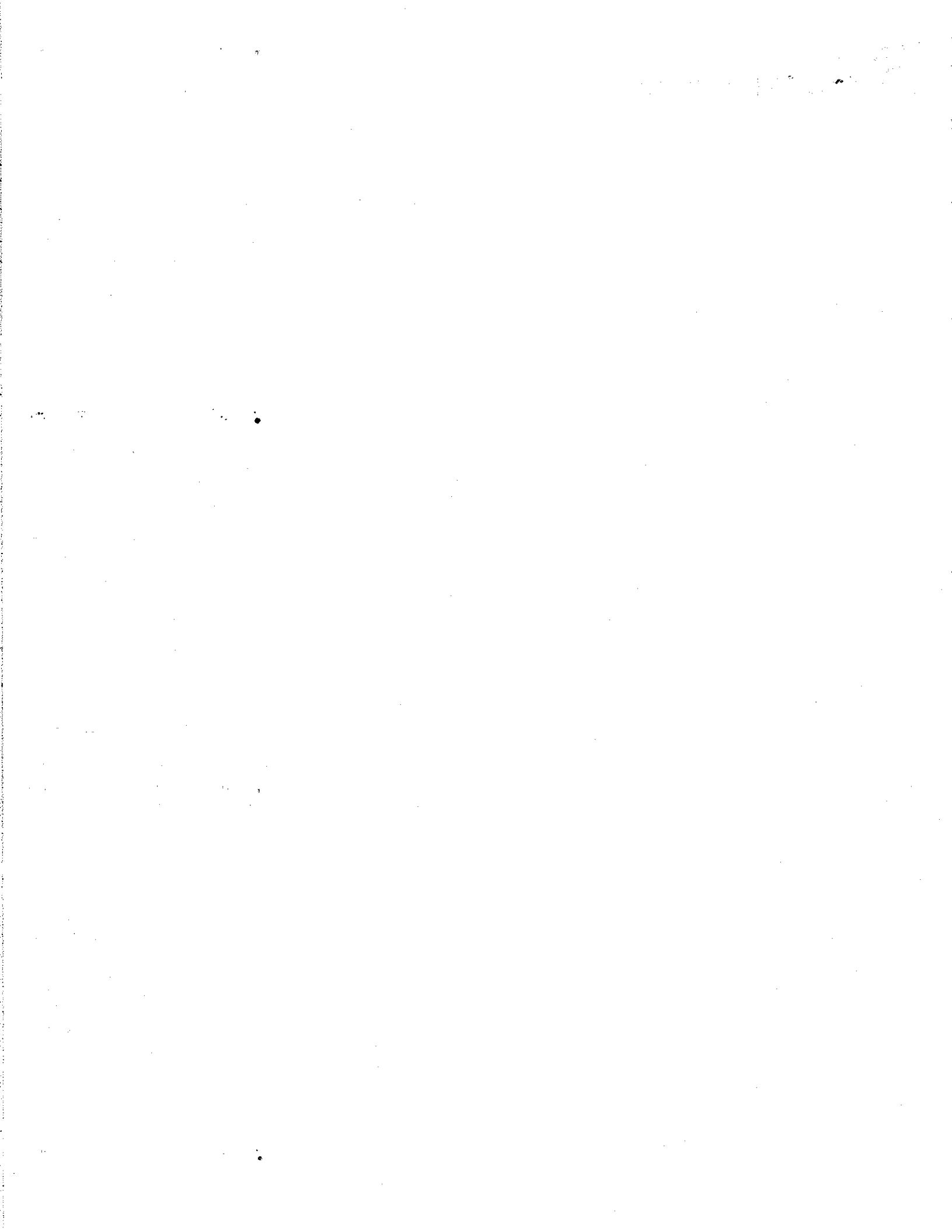
NOMINEES FOR AVCAM OFFICERS
