Faculty Updates

Dr. Christine M. Imbra

- Eight students accompanied Prof. Imbra to Italy May 13 – 27, 2012 for education abroad. The home base for the two-week course was the University of Macerata (UNIMC) in Macerata, Italy - students each participated in a 20-hour internship, toured two Italian universities and six cities, took three classes taught by Italian professors, and visited several historic landmarks and businesses during the course.
- On May 21, 2012, Prof. Imbra presented a lecture, “Marginality, Positionality, and Voice: Lesbian Leaders in the Academy” at the University of Macerata, in Macerata, Italy.
- On August 23, 2012, Prof. Imbra, Doctoral Candidate Kimberly Roan, and Master’s student Zachary Staszewski presented, “Co-teaching at the Doctoral Level” during SCSU’s Fall Convocation.

Education Abroad

The deadline for registering for the May 2013 education abroad course to Italy is February 1, 2013.

Ten individuals will be chosen to attend this course, which will take place May 13 – 27, 2013 and will cost \$4,905.00 for an SCSU master's student – the cost varies depending on student status (master's or doctorate) and residence (in-state/reciprocity vs. out-of-state).

The fee includes round-trip airfare, ground transportation in Italy, lodging, some meals, tours of three universities and six cities in Italy, three classes taught by Italian professors, tours of a variety of landmarks and regional businesses, and administrative costs.
