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DR. DARCY

DR. ROBERT DARCY has achieved considerable recognition for his contributions to economic education. He has published numerous articles and curriculum projects in economics and has conducted extensive research on the topic of manpower and human resources. He is best known as the co-author of the Manpower and Economic Education Curriculum Project for high school students, which is helping youth bridge the gap from school to work. He has been consultant to organizations ranging from the U.S. Department of Labor to the Joint Council on Economic Education, the U.S. Office of Education and the Committee for Economic Development. Professor Darcy has conducted several institutes for secondary teachers of economics and has received many prizes and awards for his research and curriculum efforts in economic education. Dr. Darcy is Professor of Economics at Colorado State University.



DR. FAIR



DR. HOUTHAKER

DR. JEAN FAIR, Professor of Education and Chairman, Department of Secondary Social Studies, Wayne State University, has made several forays into the field of education. She has authored articles in education journals and has been an editor and contributor for the National Council for the Social Studies publications, including NCSS Yearbooks and Social Education. She has been involved in a wide variety of educational activities as a high school social studies teacher and a curriculum consultant to public schools. In addition to her more recent roles as professorial educator and curriculum specialist, Dr. Fair has served as a staff member for a teacher education experimental project and a frequent conference participant for national professional education associations. Professor Fair now serves as President of the National Council for the Social Studies.



DR. MILLER

DR. HENDRICK HOUTHAKER, Professor of Economics at Harvard University, has authored articles and texts in a number of areas including economic theory, econometrics and economic policy. In 1969, President Nixon appointed Professor Houthaker as a member of his Council of Economic Advisors. Previously, he served as a member of President Johnson's Council of Economic Advisors. Dr. Houthaker has served as President of both the American Statistical Association and the Economic Society. He has conducted economic research and was on the staff of the Cowles Commission for Economic Research at the University of Chicago. Professor Houthaker is currently editor of the *Review of Economics and Statistics*.

DR. ROGER MILLER is currently Assistant Professor of Economics at the University of Washington. He has authored numerous economics texts and has been a frequent contributor to widely-read economics journals including *The American Economic Review*. Professor Miller has acquired considerable recognition as co-author of *The Economics of Public Issues*, a text which has sparked a high level of enthusiasm for teaching about the important issues of our time. Since receiving his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago, he has won several awards and honors for his professional contributions. In addition to his teaching experience, he has conducted socio-economic studies of underdeveloped countries and has served as an editorial consultant to the *Journal of American Statistical Association*. Dr. Miller is broadly experienced as a teacher, author, researcher and consultant.
