The Winter Institute speakers' program, which focuses on discrimination in the marketplace and employment discrimination laws, will be held from 8:45 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. on February 22 in Ritsche Auditorium on the SCSU campus and the luncheon will be held in Atwood Memorial Center on the SCSU campus from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
