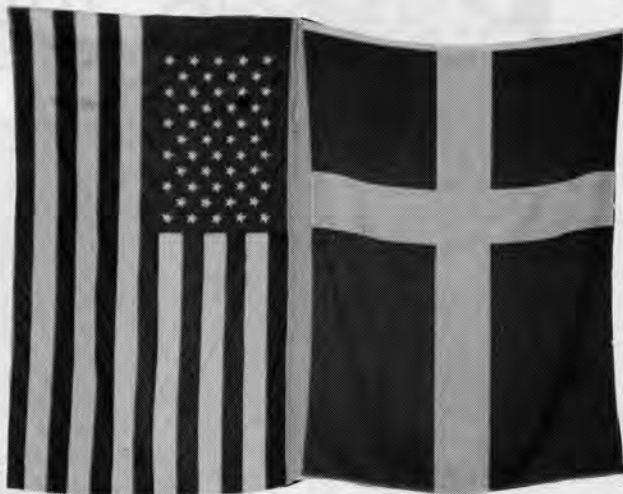
World Events

The European Peace Allies, the Danish election, the shooting down of flight 007, the Democratic presidential race, Andropov's death, the winter olympics, Lebanon, the record-breaking strength of the dollar were all significant events that occurred during our year in Denmark. Some of these events affected us more than others. Upon talking with a number of students, the invasion of Grenada stands out as that "world event which had the most impact on us during our stay.

It was a grey, danish morning when we first heard the astonishing, unbelievable news of an invasion by the American 82nd division airborne, against the tiny Caribbean Island of Grenada. The invasion frightened us because it confirmed and exposed hidden fears that President Reagan would use militaristic means to back up his unpredictable, hard line, tough talk against what he saw as a communist threat. We were confused and bewildered. We talked nervously, quietly about the draft, about possibly having to pack it up and head home. We talked a lot about commitment. We heard reports of country after country, including Denmark, denouncing and objecting to the invasion for the very same reasons we had denounced Russia's invasion of Afganistan.

Does the U.S. Military have any more right to storm into Grenada than Russia had going into Afganistan? The majority of Americans switched from condemning the invasion to condoning it. Western European countries cried out that the U.S. government based its Grenada invasion on a gross double-standard ideology. We didn't get a chance to see Reagan on the almighty television the night after the invasion was successfully completed.

Yet, here in Denmark we tended to agree with the European countries. We looked at Grenada as a definite transgression of what we thought the U.S. stood for as a democratic country advocating world peace. This has led many of us to look at ourselves and our country and re-evaluate what exactly it means to be an American.
