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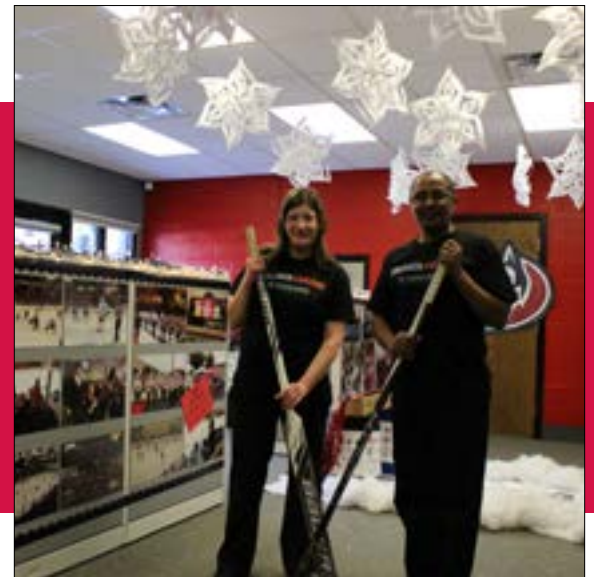
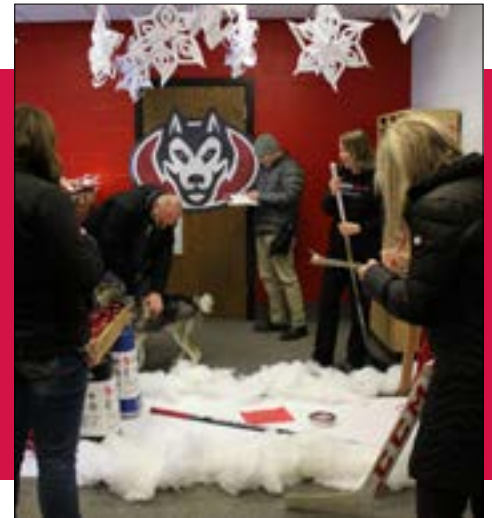
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Office Decorating Contest

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Faculty Updates

Dr. Steven McCullar



Online for Fall 2018

The Higher Education Administration Masters and Doctoral Programs will be going online starting with the 2018 cohorts. For a few years now, the faculty have been discussing the possible move to online education, looking at both the strengths and weaknesses of these types of programs.

Throughout 2017, the faculty has been specifically looking at the masters program, exploring ways to continuously improve the program while also strategizing ways to hit new markets for potential students. For years, many people have expressed interest in the doctoral program, but the weekend model did not fit their work and personal schedules. Additionally, at the beginning of the academic year, the university leadership approached the faculty about the opportunities to expand the outreach of the program to our international partners.

A decision was made to move both the masters and doctoral programs online for Fall 2018. The response institutionally and across the state has been very positive. With the help of alumni and current students, Dr. McCullar traveled across the state recruiting for the program. Applications for both programs have increased dramatically, so much so, that Cohort 12 is full with 23 students admitted with some applicants admitted for the Fall 2019 Cohort 13. The masters and certificate program have 15 students at this time with a few slots still open for potential applicants. The new students for the program will be from all over the state of Minnesota and at least one student connecting with us from China.

Steven McCullar traveled to Southwest Minnesota State University, Winnona State University and Rochester Community Technical College for recruiting for Higher Education Masters and Doctoral Programs.

Additionally, this spring, he presented at the NASPA National Conference in “Reflection on Student Affairs Crisis Response Using Crisis Experience for an Evolving Profession” as a leader of roundtable discussion and “Working with Adjuncts in a Higher Education Program”. He was nominated for the Miller Scholars Award.

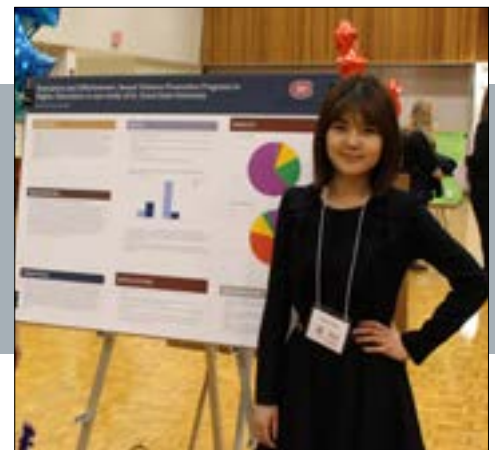
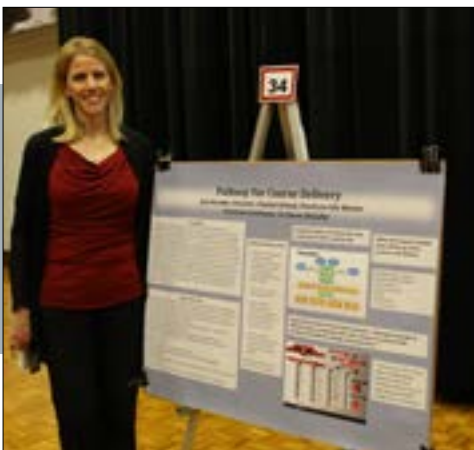


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2018 Huskies Showcase

This award recognizes dedicated professionals who demonstrate leadership and innovation in the field of higher education. The award honors the work of Christine M. Imbra, professor emerita of Higher Education Administration at St. Cloud State University.

Award Winner

Dr. Derrick Lindstrom, Dean of Liberal Arts and Transfer at Minneapolis Community & Technical College. He has worked with different higher education institutions for 17 years, immersing himself in the field of academia as a professor, a department coordinator, and now as a dean. He oversees almost 189 faculty members, representing 29 disciplines and 16 academic awards. Dr. Lindstrom is also the supervisor of Library Operations. In the administration area, he provides strategic leadership and direction to the E-learning and Campus Academic Technology Team. Dr. Lindstrom also leads many projects including the Advising and Academic Communities, curriculum and catalog navigator. He serves as the Representative on the Communication Studies State Wide Transfer Pathway Team. Finally, Dr. Lindstrom serves as a Peer Corp Member & Site Visit Team Member, and Assurance Review Team for Higher Learning Commission.
