

Wright Aero Dispatcher Rhoda Clayton to Retire After 35 Years!

A well-known, loved, and legendary fixture at the St. Cloud Regional Airport will be stepping down this fall. Wright Aero Chief Dispatcher Rhoda Clayton will be retiring after 35 years in the aviation industry. Over the years, many students have simply known her as "Rhoda" who dispatches training aircraft at Wright Aero. There is much more to Rhoda than most people know from their dealings with this highly competent, professional, and friendly individual. In addition to dispatching aircraft, Rhoda is an accomplished pilot. She has a private pilot certificate and many years ago, assisted in ferrying an airplane or two to Alaska. She has traveled extensively and has been to 46 states in the US. Rhoda was not always an aircraft dispatcher. In 1970, she started working at the old airport (where the St. Cloud Whitney Center now sits) as a waitress.

Department News

The Department of Aviation had their first annual **Open House** in Headley Hall. The public had an opportunity to use the Air Traffic Control Simulation Lab and Beech 1900 turboprop simulator. The purpose of the event was to promote career opportunities in the aviation field.

A new advanced 4-station **Air Traffic Control Simulation Lab** was developed by Dr. Patrick Mattson. The software allows students to gain experience as an air traffic controller. The lab will be used extensively for Advanced Air Traffic Control (AVIT 415).

Several faculty members from the Department of Aviation and several aviation students had a chance to test PC based software that simulates the flight deck of a Regional Jet for possible program implementation starting Fall 2005. Students would learn how various systems on a Regional Jet work ranging from programming a Flight Management System (FMS) to starting the engines.

The Department of Aviation will be offering two new courses. **Aviation Electronics Systems** will cover contemporary flight management systems (FMS) including GPS, VOR, and glass cockpit technologies. **Ethics in Aviation** will cover legal, regulatory, and ethical aspects and standards in the aviation industry. Other topics will include aviation/airline customer service, employee relations in hiring, promotion, and termination.

The Department of Aviation will be exploring the viability of creating and developing an accredited **Master's Degree in Aviation** sometime during the next several years.


