Keynoter



Rudiger Dornbusch is Ford International Professor of Economics, Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Dr. Dornbusch's research and writing have focused on international economic policy. He is the author or editor of ten books, including *Dollars, Debts and Deficits* and *Exchange Rates and Inflation*. He has written many articles for professional journals and is a frequent contributor to magazines and newspapers.

Dornbusch is a Fellow of both the Econometric Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He was the recipient of the John Simon Guggenheim Fellowship in 1979. He delivered the Gaston Eyskens Lectures at Catholic University of Leuven in 1984; the Graham Lectures at Princeton University in 1985; the Lionel Robbins Lectures at the London School of Economics in 1986; and the Hicks Lecture at Oxford University in 1988.

Dornbusch is an Associate Editor of the *Quarterly Journal of Economics* and the *Journal of International Economics*. He is a member of the Brookings Panel on Economic Activity and on the Advisory Committee of the Institute for International Economics. He is a Director of the Brazil Fund and Advisory Director of the First Mercantile Fund (Toronto).

Educated at the University of Geneva and the University of Chicago, Dornbusch received his Ph.D. from the latter in 1971. He became a member of the MIT economics department in 1975.

Featured Speakers



Peter Morici is Associate Professor of Economics and Canadian Studies at the University of Maine. Prior to his appointment at the University in 1988, Dr. Morici was Vice President of the National Planning Association in Washington, D.C. In that capacity, he directed research on international economic policy and Canadian-American relations. He remains active with NPA as an adjunct senior fellow.

Morici is an adjunct fellow at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington and serves as Secretary-Treasurer of the Association for Canadian Studies. He is a member of a Study Group on Canada-U.S. Trade Negotiations for the Council on Foreign Relations. He also is a member of the Atlantic Council and is on the board of the North American Economics and Finance Association.

Dr. Morici is the author of four books and many monographs and journal articles. His most recent work *Reassessing American Competitiveness* is a comprehensive assessment of the interrelated factors that should be addressed to improve U.S. trade performance.

Morici received his Ph.D. from the State University of New York at Albany in 1974.



Jeffrey Simpson is National Columnist for the *Toronto Globe and Mail*, a position he has held since 1984. He joined the *Globe and Mail* in 1973 and became a member of the Ottawa bureau in 1976. Subsequently he was appointed bureau chief. From 1981-1983 he was based in London and served as the European correspondent for his newspaper. Simpson was the winner of the National Magazine Award (politics) in 1988 and the National Newspaper Award for column writing in 1988. For his book *Discipline of Power*, Simpson received the Governor-General's Award for Non-Fiction in 1981. His most recent book is *Spoils of Power: The History of Political Patronage in Canada*. His articles appear often in newspapers, magazines and professional journals in both Canada and the United States. He is a regular panelist on the CBC's Sunday Report.

Mr. Simpson earned an undergraduate degree in Politics from Queen's University and a Master's degree from the London School of Economics in International Relations.



Catherine Mann is Economist in the Office of the Vice President-Development Economics at The World Bank. In this capacity she is working on the *World Development Report 1989* analyzing the economic foundation of lending strategies. Her talk will provide a sneak preview of this report.

Prior to her accepting this position at the World Bank, Dr. Mann was an economist in the International Finance Division, Board of Governors of The Federal Reserve in Washington. Her research focus was on trade policy, and the impact of market structure and protection on trade patterns and exchange rate pass-through. She was the recipient of a Special Achievement Award for her work at the Fed in 1986. She was employed with Chase Manhattan Bank in the International Portfolio Department from 1977-1979.

Educated at Radcliffe and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Mann received her Ph.D. in Economics in 1984 from MIT.
