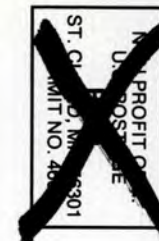
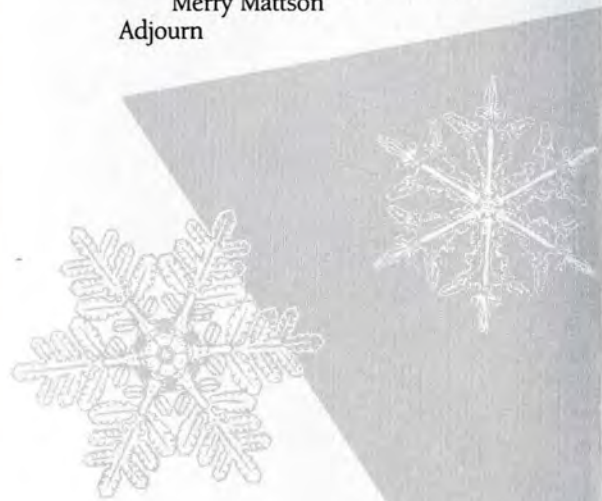

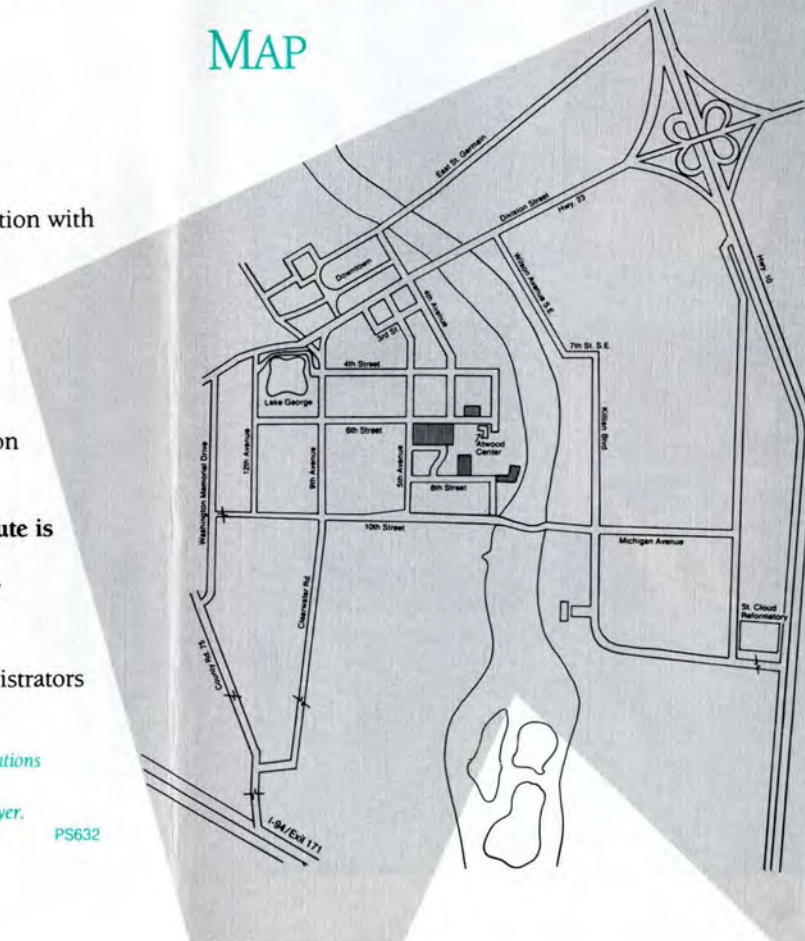

Anne O. Krueger

Anne O. Krueger is Arts and Science professor at Duke University. Dr. Krueger served as Vice President, Economics and Research, The World Bank, 1982-86. Her research and writing have covered a broad spectrum of economic and social issues with a primary focus on international trade and economic development. She is the

author or editor of 15 books, including *Perspectives on Trade and Development* and *The Political Economy of International Trade*, both published in 1990. In addition, she has written parts to more than 50 other books and scores of professional articles, and has presented invited lectures literally around the world.

Krueger is a Fellow of both the American Academy of Arts and Science and the Econometric Society. She was the recipient of both the Kenan Enterprise Award and the Bernhard-Harms Prize in 1990. She has been elected by her professional colleagues to serve as Vice President of the American Economics Association and President of the Midwest Economics Association.

Krueger currently serves on the Advisory Board for *Revista de Economia Politica* and the Board of Editors for *Economics and Finance*. Since 1987 she has served as Co-Director of the National Bureau of Economic Research.

Educated at Oberlin College and the University of Wisconsin, Krueger received her Ph.D. from the latter in 1958. She received an Honorary Doctorate from Hacettepe University, Ankara, Turkey in 1990.



Noël Devisch

Noël Devisch is a member of the Board of Directors of the Belgian Boerenbond. He served as a personal adviser to members of the Commission of the European countries from 1980 to 1989. Prior to that he was an adviser to the Belgian Minister for Agriculture.

Dr. Devisch has received a truly international education. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Louvain (Belgium); M.S. from the University of Reading (United Kingdom); and Ph.D. from the University of Missouri (USA).

Peter Coffey currently holds the U.S. West Chair at the University of St. Thomas and is a visiting professor at the Graduate Institute of European Studies, at the Free University of Brussels. He is a member of the Executive Council of the CEPREM (a study group for research into the creation of a European currency) and is Chief Research Coordinator for economics of the Group of 12. He is the author of 16 books.

Coffey studied at the University of Durham (North England) and was a Fulbright Scholar. He is the recipient of the Mellon Fellowship and the Winant Fellowship.

Joe Chenoweth is Senior Corporate Vice President for International Operations, Honeywell.

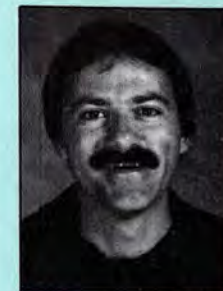
