Safety Focus: Icing Conditions

The onset of winter weather means the simultaneous arrival of cold temperatures and their accompaniment of corresponding weather conditions. The season of winter can be likened to the proverbial double-edged sword, in that those of us who enjoy the cold and its myriad of outdoor activities have reason to be happy. The rest of us however, may see only the cold, snow, sleet, ice, and bad driving conditions. ARRGGHH!!! True to form, winter also brings some weather of its own that is rather intense at times, and even potentially dangerous to aviation operations.

Although most of us are at least somewhat familiar with the possible dangers that are associated with winter weather, the wise pilot (and person) will recognize the value of refamiliarization with winter aviation operations.

With regard to flight operations in winter weather, the best rule of thumb to follow is this: Avoid flight into known icing conditions, especially if your aircraft is not rated as such for this type of flight activity. The primary point that I am trying to make is this: You can always fly another day. With this factor in mind, here are some things to do to help keep you safe during icing conditions or other winter weather, whether you are in the air or on the ground.

- Be alert to the weather at all times, especially when preparing to fly
- Learn as much as you can about flight in icing conditions
- Pay close attention to METARS, TAFs, and PIREPS with respect to icing conditions
- Use sound judgment
- Exercise caution in decision-making about flying in adverse weather conditions
- Conduct a thorough pre-flight check of all anti-icing features (if your aircraft is equipped)
- Check pitot tube heat before flight to ensure that it is working
- Dress appropriately to protect yourself from frostbite, hypothermia, and cold exposure
