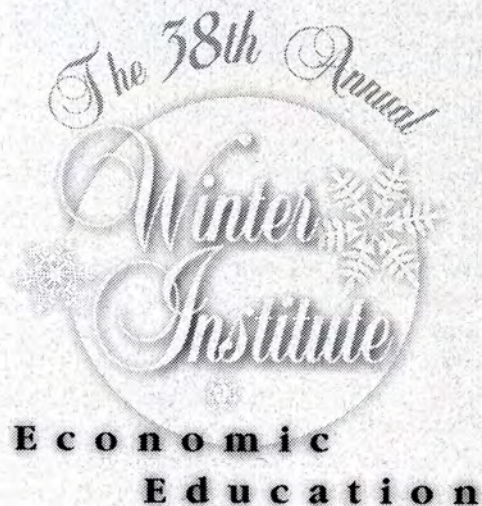

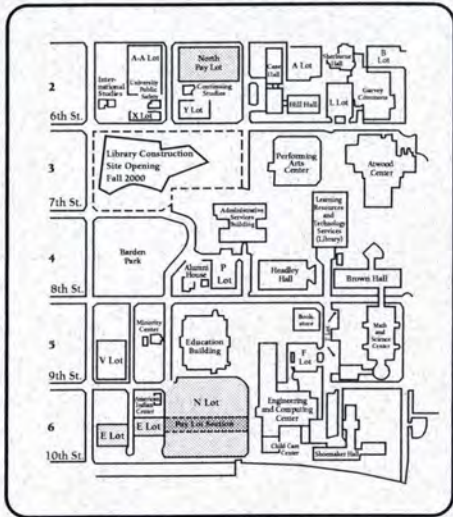

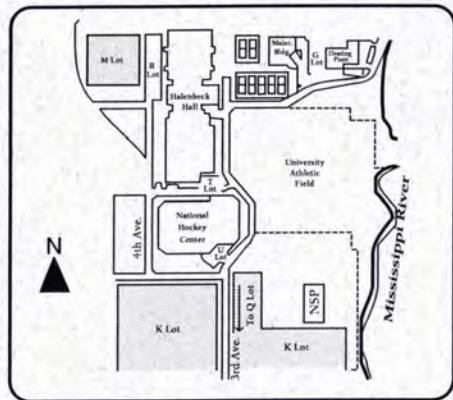

PARKING

Dr. Kevin M. Murphy is the George Pratt Shultz Professor of Business Economics and Industrial Relations at the University of Chicago Graduate School of Business. He has been a member of the Chicago faculty since 1983.

Professor Murphy is the recipient of numerous awards and fellowships, including a Sloan Foundation Fellowship and an Earhart Foundation Fellowship. He is a Fellow of the Econometric Society, a Faculty Research Fellow at the National Bureau of Economic Research, a member of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences, and the author of some 45 published articles. His most recent research has focused on returns to education and skill, unemployment, human capital and growth, and income inequality. Articles about Murphy's research have appeared in *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and many local papers.

In 1997 Murphy was the recipient of the prestigious John Bates Clark Medal, awarded every two years by the American Economics Association to the most distinguished young economist in the U.S.

Professor Murphy lives in the Chicago area. He is the president of Flossmoor Baseball & Softball, a coach and former commissioner of the Homewood-Flossmoor Soccer Club, and also sits on the Flossmoor District 161 Board of Education.

Dr. Murphy received a B.A. in economics from the University of California at Los Angeles, where he was Phi Beta Kappa, in 1981. He received a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago in 1986, writing his thesis on "Specialization and Human Capital."

Christopher-Farrell is co-host of *Sound Money*, a weekly one-hour personal finance call-in show produced by Minnesota Public Radio and syndicated to more than 170 markets. He is also chief economics correspondent for Minnesota Public Radio. Chris is host of *Right on the Money*, a public television personal finance program produced by Minnesota Public Television. *Right on the Money* reaches more than 65% of U.S. households, and is currently in its second season.



Chris Farrell

Chris is contributing economics editor at *Business Week* magazine. He has been associated with *Business Week* since 1986, first covering corporate finance and later economics. A frequent contributor to the magazine's extensive coverage of the economy, Chris has written numerous cover stories, including IPO Capitalism, Productivity to the Rescue, Why Are We So Afraid of Growth, What's Wrong, and the Economics of Aging. In 1994 the *Forbes Media Guide* named him one of the nation's most influential economists. Chris Farrell and a team of producers, editors and reporters received a 1999 Loeb Award for "The World Turns Upside Down," a one-hour radio documentary of the end of inflation; the team also received a Medill School of Journalism/Strong Funds Financial Writers and Editors Award.

Chris broke into journalism when he covered the markets for *Business Times* (it existed from 1983 to 1985), a pioneering business news television program carried nationally on ESPN. He also worked on *Business Times* radio, a half-hour radio show syndicated nationally on public radio. The rest of his career is eclectic. He edited *The Atlantic City Gamble*, an economic and political analysis of the gambling industry in Atlantic City; wrote articles geared toward small business for the newsletter, *Boardroom Reports*; and worked for Elliot Janeway, a financial newsletter writer. From 1976 to 1979, he worked on and off in the engine room of various merchant ships.

Chris Farrell was educated at Stanford University (B.A.) and the London School of Economics (M.A.).
