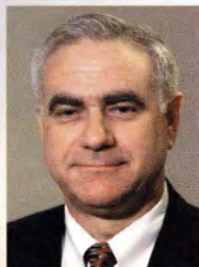

Martin A. Regalia is vice president for economic and tax policy and chief economist of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Prior to joining the Chamber in April 1993, Dr. Regalia was the director of research for the Savings and Community Bankers of America. Prior to that post, in June 1992 when the group was founded, Dr. Regalia was executive vice president of policy development and chief economist

for the National Council of Community Bankers — one of SCBA's predecessor organizations.

Dr. Regalia also served as the principle analyst in the Fiscal Analysis Division at the Congressional Budget Office, as an economist for the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in both the banking and capital markets sections, and as financial economist for the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Additionally, Dr. Regalia served as a consultant to the Thrift Institutions Advisory Council to the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System and was a visiting instructor in the School of Government and Business, The George Washington University.

Dr. Regalia has appeared on national television news and debate programs, has testified before several congressional committees, has authored articles and publications on a variety of economic topics, and speaks to a variety of groups across the country.

Dr. Regalia holds a B.A. with honors in economics from the University of Santa Clara and an M.A. in economics and a Ph.D. in monetary economics from the University of Wisconsin.



John R. Lott Jr., Ph.D., is a resident scholar at the American Research Institute. His areas of research include crime, antitrust, education, gun control, campaign finance and voting and legislative behavior.

Dr. Lott's professional experiences include Yale University School of Law senior research scholar; Law and Economics Fellow, University of Chicago School of Law; Chief Economist, U.S. Sentencing Commission; Fellow at Stanford University

Hoover Institution; and visiting assistant professor at the Graduate School of Business-University of Chicago, Cornell University Law School, Department of Economics, Rice University, and the Department of Economics-Texas A&M University.

Dr. Lott is the author of several books and articles. His books include *Are Predatory Commitments Credible?: Who Should the Courts Believe?* and *More Guns, Less Crime: Understanding Crime and Gun Control Laws*. Dr. Lott has published articles that have appeared in the *Chicago Tribune*, *Los Angeles Times*, *New York Times*, *USA Today*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *American Economic Review* and *The Journal of Political Economy*.

In addition, Dr. Lott has appeared on ABC News *World News Tonight*; CBS News, *The Early Show*; CNN, *Talkback Live*; Fox News Channel; MSNBC; NBC *Nightly News*, *The Today Show* and PBS, *The Newshour with Jim Lehrer*.

Dr. Lott holds his B.A. magna cum laude from the University of California at Los Angeles; and his Ph.D., economics, from the University of California at Los Angeles.
