BOHALL, ARMINDA M. (WEEKS) (NOTTAGE)

Arminda Mary Weeks was born January 14, 1848, in Diana, Lewis County, New York, of the parents, James P. and Mary C. (Clarke) Weeks, being one of a family of eight children, five of whom have preceded her in death.

The family moved from New York state to Southwestern Wisconsin, settling near Burlington, where they resided for a number of years and then moved to Minnesota where James P. Weeks pre-empted land which later became the townsite of the present village of Browerville, Todd County. Later the family moved out to a farm in Ashley township, near Sauk Centre. There Arminda Mary Weeks was married February 22, 1868, to George Hager Nottage, who died March 11, 1874. To them were born three sons: William J. of Newberg, Oregon; George W. and Julius P. of Kasson, Minnesota.

Left a widow with three sons, the oldest of whom was but five years of age, followed by a year of illness in which mother hovered between life and death the major portion of the time for ten years she struggled to keep the family together, caring for her children as only a devoted mother could with meager means at hand.

On March 18, 1884, Arminda M. (Weeks) Nottage was married to C. F. Bohall at Long Prairie, Minnesota, and took up their residence on Mr. Bohall's farm at West Union, Minnesota. On July 1, 1889, a daughter Julia, was born to this union. She died September 19, 1890.

In 1903 C. F. Bohall's retired from farming and made their home in Sauk Centre, where Mr. Bohall died on April 26, 1906.

Arminda (Weeks) (Nottage) Bohall made her home with her

sons for a number of years following the death of her husband. She finally located in Newberg, Oregon where she built a home near that of her eldest son, where she remained twenty-five years.

Arminda (Weeks) (Nottage) Bohall died at her home at Newberg, Oregon on January 29, 1938, at the age of 90 years, 15 days. Interment was made in the Friends Cemetery, Newberg, Oregon. She was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Women's Relief Corps.
