FIELD, ADELBERT SINCLAIR

Adelbert Sinclair Field was born June 7, 1873 in New Diggins, Lafayette County, Wisconsin, son of Benjamin F. Fields and Emaline (Williams) Field.

When he was five years old his parents moved to Iowa but lived there only about two years and then moved to Minnesota settling near Royalton and later Saint Cloud.

He received most of his schooling in Royalton.

When he arrived in Saint Cloud he started work in the flour mill owned by George Tileston where he worked for twenty-six years. He later worked two years at the Bridgeman saw mill and two summers at the Anderson saw mill.

January 8, 1889 he was married to Miss Ida Turner. Judge Roeser officiated at their wedding. Ida Turner was born in Steele County Minnesota, near Owtanna on April 8, 1876 daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Christ Turner. Her father was employed at the Tileston flour mill in Saint Cloud.

Adelbert S. and Ida (Turner) Field have six children they are: Pearl; Harold; Howard; Floyd; Stanley; and Rudy. They have six grandchildren.

Mr. Field's grandfather Fields was one of the forty-niners. He drove to California by way of Pikes' Peak with an ox team and schooner. The journey took six months and they often came across the remains of raided wagon trains. However, his journey was a failure as he found no gold.

Mr. A. S. Fields was one of the old log drivers on the Mississippi and Platt rivers.
