HUBERTY, FRANK

Frank Huberty was born December 3, 1852 in Luxemburg, on der Sauer, Germany, the son of Nicholas and Maria (Penning) Huberty.

Nicholas and Maria (Penning) Huberty were born in Germany and were married there. In Germany they operated a large farm as a means of making their livelihood and were a well-to-do family. After several years of married life, Maria Huberty's father erected a large mill in Germany and not being able to finance it alone and was forced to make a loan. In order to get the loan he had to put up security and unable to do this, his son-in-law, Nicholas furnished the security, signing over his farm. This venture did not prove successful, however, and Nicholas lost his farm and was reduced to a poor man.

In the year 1882, Frank Huberty and his brother Nicholas, left their native land and came to America and at once came west to St. Cloud. Unable to find work there he continued his trip west to the Black Hills of South Dakota. Here he became lost and went without food or drink for three days before he found his way to a settler.

After leaving South Dakota, he traveled through Iowa. This state was quite well settled at the time. Here he remained for a short time, working as a farm hand, and then returned to Minnesota where he found employment on a farm.

After a few years, on May 20, 1889, he was ^{here} united in marriage to Anna Schneider of Avon, and they settled on a farm in Farming township. After three years there, they moved on a small farm near Avon where they resided a year and six months, and then moved to Albany where he purchased a lot and built a home.

Here he found employment on the railroad as a section hand and remained at this work for 30 years, when he was retired, due to old age.

Frank and Anna (Schneider) Huberty are the parents of seven children: John of Chicago; Nicholas (deceased); Andrew, of Chicago, Frank, Paul, in North Dakota; Susanna (deceased); and Clara of Cambridge, Minnesota.

After the death of his first wife Frank Huberty married again, to Mrs. Alvina Verkennis of Melrose. The marriage took place at Albany August 25, 1903.

Mrs. Verkennis had one child, William, by a previous marriage, he is now in the Veterans Hospital at St. Cloud. An adopted child, Mary, is now Mrs. DeZurk of Sartell, Minnesota. Six of the Huberty children served during the World War.

Today at their advanced age, Frank Huberty and his wife enjoy the best of health.
