Albert Kremer was born in Luxemburg, Germany, July 27, 1857. He came to Minnesota in 1880.

Albert Kremer received all the schooling he could attain which was up to one year of college in Luxemburg, Germany. He never attended any schools in America. He learned the English language by listening to others speak, and after being here one year could speak the English language very well.

Albert Kremer helped his father on the farm for some time then hired himself out to other farmers for the period of two years. With the money he earned he purchased a farm near the village of Luxemburg, Minnesota. Albert Kremer worked this farm until the year of 1910.

Mr. Kremer's first tools were very limited as to style and number, consisting of an axe, hoe, rake, and craddle. Later he bought a self-rake. Before retiring from the farm he had everything in the latest line of farm machinery. Albert Kremer raised a variety of crops, they were wheat, oats, and barley.

Mr. Albert Kremer was married to Gretchen Jocholy on the eleventh day of May 1886. Albert and Gretchen (Jocholy) Kremer celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary on May 11, 1936 at which celebration many people extended their best wishes. At the event the Old Heidelberger Band played many of the old time selections in the honor of the occasion.

Mr. and Mrs. Kremer had three children, Frank A. Kremer, a salesman in St. Paul, Minnesota; Rose (Kremer) Schellinger, deceased; Christine (Kremer) Boos, of Saint Cloud, Minnesota.

Mr. Albert Kremer's father and mother were Frank and Margaret (Schmidt) Kremer. The sisters and brother of Albert Kremer are, Joseph Kremer, Tenth Avenue North, St. Cloud, Minnesota; Michael Kremer, deceased; Anna (Kremer) Stiechen, Ninth Avenue South, St. Cloud, Minnesota; John
