LAMMERSON, BERNARD F.

Bernard F. Lammerson was born in Steinhein, Westphalia, Germany, August 2, 1863, son of William and Fernanda (Baierenke) Lammerson.

As a young man he attended school and became interested in the meat cutting trade. He left for America in 1880 to find employment. He came to Minnesota and secured a job in Minneapolis. Bernard stayed in Minneapolis two months and then came to St. Cloud. In St. Cloud he worked for Valentine Wetzel several years and then formed a partnership with Frank Hunstinger. Together Bernard and Frank Hunstinger purchased the Wetzel Market and started a prosperous business institution. This market was moved twice and each time Bernard Lammerson and Frank Hunstinger erected new buildings. After several years of profitable business this partnership was dissolved and Bernard started buying and shipping stock for a packing concern.

Not liking this form of work Bernard formed another partnership with Benjamin Kost and opened another meat market. After several years of successful operation this market was sold to Martin Molitor.

In 1905 Bernard Lammerson and Benjamin Kost opened a packing plant in St. Cloud. This was a very modern institution.

After several years in this business Bernard sold his interest and opened a meat market in East St. Cloud. He managed this successfully until his death, March 1, 1934.

Bernard Lammerson was a very persistent and hard workman. He was a shrewd business man and a capable manager as shown by the progress he made in establishing various business firms of this city.

Bernard Lammerson married Anna Danneker in St. Cloud, Minnesota.

Anna Danneker was born in St. Paul, Minnesota, July 14, 1875, daughter of Joseph and Gertrude Danneker.

To Bernard and Anna (Danneker) Lammerson were born five children,
