MC INTYRE, MINER

Miner Mc Intyre was a native of Colden, New York. He served through the Civil War with the 9th New York Cavalry. He took part in the campaign in Virginia. Miner Mc Intyre was discharged at Winchester, Virginia, after Lee's surrender in 1865.

On December 23, 1869, Miner Mc Intyre married Anna V. Riddle at Silver Creek, New York. Anna (Riddle) Mc Intyre was born in Edinburgh, Scotland. She came to America when she was seven years old.

Miner and Anna (Riddle) Mc Intyre had three children: Herbert, Ralph, and Edward.

In the fall of 1872, the Mc Intyres came to Minnesota and settled on a homestead in Todd County.

In 1882, they moved to Lyman Prairie where they lived until sometime after 1900 when they moved into a part of Sauk Centre known as Hoboken. He then was employed as a rural mail carrier here.

Miner and Anna (Riddle) Mc Intyre celebrated their golden wedding anniversary on December 23, 1919, at their home in Hoboken.
