NEHRING, SAMUEL

Samuel Nehring was born in Germany on December 19, 1833. He had four brothers and three sisters, they are: John, Christ, Michael, Ferdinand, Sophie (Nehring) Hietke; Agustie (Nehring) Frank; and Mrs. Ferdinand Gehrke.

After Samuel came to America, he made his home in Monroe, Wisconsin. At this place, he was married to Hannah L. Arndt. One child was born to this union; a son, Julius. He was born May 18, 1860, his mother Hannah (Arndt) Nehring passed away the same day. She was buried in the cemetery at Monroe, Wisconsin. Julius was cared for by a neighbor woman until his father, Samuel, was married the second time. He came to Zion township, Stearns County, Minnesota in 1865.

On June 18, 1885, Julius Nehring was united in marriage to Augusta Plantikow. The ceremony took place in the Salem Church in Zion township. After their marriage, they began farming on one hundred and sixty acres of land in Paynesville township. They remained on this farm until 1904 when Julius retired and moved into Paynesville with his family. Julius and Augusta (Plantikow) Nehring were the parents of four children, they are: Ervin H., Roda and Lilah, twin girls, and Orlanda.

Julius Nehring passed away at his home in Paynesville, February 8, 1927. He was laid to rest in the Zion Cemetery.

Samuel Nehring's second marriage was to Anna D. Butt, who was born in Germany in 1843. They made their home in Onike, Stevens County, Illinois in 1861. Nine children were born of this union, they are: Matilda, John, Elizabeth, George, died in infancy; Lydia, Emanuel, Ida, Annie and Josephine. At the present time, only four of the children are living.

Matilda and Lydia live in St. Paul, Minnesota; Annie lives in Duluth, Minnesota; and John lives in Paynesville, Minnesota.

John Nehring married Wilhelmina Henneman of Trevor, Wisconsin on June 25, 1893. Wilhelmina was the daughter of Christ and Augusta (Luck) Henneman and she was born in Germany. John Nehring is a painter by trade.

Anna (Butt) Nehring, the ~~second~~ wife of Samuel Nehring, passed away the spring of 1879, following the birth of Josephine, the youngest child. She was buried in the Salem Cemetery.

In the spring of 1865, Samuel left Illinois and came to Stearns County, Minnesota where he settled on Section twenty-one of Zion township.

Mary Luck was Samuel Nehring's third wife. She was born in Germany and came to America in the fall of 1881. They were married on December 18, 1881 in St. Cloud, Minnesota. They lived on the old farm in Section twenty-one, Zion township. Five children were the result of this union, who are: Emil, Paul, Mabel, Howard, and one child which died in infancy. Emil lives in Bowbells, North Dakota; Mabel and Howard live in St. Paul, Minnesota; and Paul lives in Paynesville, Minnesota.

Paul Nehring married Esther Frank, daughter of William and Louisa (Arndt) Frank, on December 19, 1912. They have two daughters; Madeline and Winifred. Paul is employed as an engineer in the North American Creamery Association of Paynesville, Minnesota.

Samuel and Mary (Luck) Nehring lived on their farm for twenty-five years before moving into the village of Paynesville in April 1906.

Shortly after they came to town, Samuel passed away. His death occurred August 6, 1906, and he was laid to rest in the Salem cemetery.

Mary (Luck) Nehring remained in Paynesville until 1918 when she was married to Edward Michaelis, on August 18, 1918. They went to Cooperstown, North Dakota to live. She rented out her home in Paynesville during the time she was gone.

Edward Michaelis was born in Germany in 1842. When he was nineteen years old, he went to Canada where he stayed for eight years before coming to Cooperstown, North Dakota. He was a very prosperous farmer, owning quite a number of farms besides several places in town. After his marriage to Mrs. Mary (Luck) Nehring he rented out all his land and lived in town.

Edward Michaelis passed away December 16, 1927 and was laid to rest in the cemetery at Cooperstown, North Dakota.

After the death of Edward, Mary (Luck)(Nehring) Michaelis left North Dakota and lived with her children in St. Paul, Minnesota, for ten years. In the spring of 1937, she moved back to her home in Paynesville, Minnesota and is residing there at the present time.

The Samuel Nehring family have followed the faith of the Evangelical Church.
