SLATTERY, ALBERT JUNIOR

Albert Slattery was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota October 1, 1860, one of a family of six children; His father and mother were Mr. and Mrs. Albert Slattery Senior they lived in Minneapolis until 1876 when Mr. and Mrs. Albert Slattery Senior moved to Clearwater Lyndentownship, Stearns county, where they lived for three years and then moved to Sauk Centre. There both Mr. and Mrs. Albert Slattery Senior died. Albert Slattery Junior's schooling was all received in Sauk Centre. His teachers were Mr. Cook, D. D. Stormes, and Anna Stabler. Mr. Slattery says at that time his father paid \$2.00 a month tution for the teacher.

On February 1, 1881 Albert Slattery was married to Clara Fitima. Clara (Fitima) Slattery was born in Sauk Centre.

To Albert and Clara (Fitima) Slattery were born eight children seven of whom are still living. Clark Slattery is employed at the St. Cloud Reformatory; Alfred died in 1896; he was drowned in Minneapolis; Nora Slattery is now Mrs. John Patterson and lives in Minneapolis; Grace now is Mrs. J. Clayton; Jesse Slattery is now working for the Fritz Cross Company in St. Cloud; Laura is now Mrs. Brandburger and also lives in St. Cloud; Dewey Slattery is in New York, New York; Helen Slattery is now Mrs. A. Lively and lives in Livingston, Montana; Albert Slattery Junior is a carpenter by trade and he has followed this work for many years. He was foreman for the Northern Pacific Railroad for several years, and also helped build the original Tilesen Mill in St. Cloud. Albert Slattery says he can remember Dr. McMasters who was an army suregon in Sauk Centre, a Dr. Palmer also from Sauk Centre, C. M. Sprague a banker, and who also had a feed mill.

H. A. Cooper who was in the Real Estate Business, and Mr. Tilesen who owned the Tilesen mill in St. Cloud. He can also remember Mr. Tilesen drowning in the Mississippi River below the 10th Street bridge, when a team of horses Mr. Tilesen was driving, were scared and threw him in the current of the River. Mr. Slattery is seventy-six years old and in good health.
