STREBEL, ALBERT J.

Albert J. Strebel was born in Gaylord, Minnesota on August 18, 1882. He graduated from the Gaylord High School. He was a graduate of Carleton College, Northfield, Minnesota.

In 1905, Albert Strebel came to Sauk Centre. He entered the Merchant's National Bank as Bookkeeper. In 1906 he was elected teller. On May 4, 1907 he became assistant cashier and in March, 1924 he became the cashier and Vice President of the Merchants' National Bank.

On July 19, 1911, Albert J. Strebel was married to Alice Jane Dean, in Sauk Centre by Rev. Mitchell. She was the daughter of William S. and Mary (Irwin) Dean. Alice(Dean) Strebel was born on December 25, 1879 in Minneapolis. In 1881, her parents moved to Sauk Centre where William Dean operated a farm implement business.

Albert J. and Alice (Dean) Strebel had two children: Mary Elizabeth born on July 12, 1912; and Jane Dean born on July 26, 1913.

Alice (Dean) Strebel was a member of the Episcopal Church and the St. Mary's Guild of Sauk Centre.

In 1928, Albert Strebel became a member of the School Board, and office he held until 1933. He became treasurer of the district. He was also made treasurer of the Sauk Centre Fire Department.

Albert Strebel was secretary of the Stearns County Fair Association and of the Sauk Centre Community Club. He retired under volition.

Albert Strebel was a mason. In 1908, he became a member of Star in the West Blue Lodge, Sauk Centre Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, Sauk Centre. He was also in the Council of Royal and Select Masters and Pilgrim Commandery, Knights Templar. He filled all the important office in the Masonic Body.

Albert Strebel was a vestryman in the Episcopal Church.

On February 1, 1933, Albert Strebel was transferred by the First Bank Stock Corporation to Spring Valley. His family also moved there. He was known as "Streb" to his friends.

In May, Albert Strebel suffered a nervous breakdown and in June entered the Mound Sanitarium of St. Paul, where he died on September 1, 1933. He is buried in Lakewood Cemetery, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Alice (Dean) Strebel died on November 1, 1936. She is buried in Lakewood Cemetery in Minneapolis.
