August 17th, 1944

My dear Virginia:

Thank you very much for the birthday card. It is very pleasant to be remembered and I appreciate it. I had not thought much about it, would have been glad to be able to forget that I have lived so long. I was delighted to see your father and mother and to find them, though tired, still well, with nothing seriously the matter with either. Also I was very glad to be sure that you were so pleasantly located and were happy in your work. You see I think a lot about you, and about every one of my grand children and hope and pray that all will be well with you, and every one of them. I am here in a cottage 23 miles south of Frankfort, Mich. Which your Uncle Hal has bought. Your Mother will tell you how it came about if you care to know. She & Daddy seemed interested in the details and description of the place. So I will only tell you that we came here in, that means your Uncle Hal, Aunt Mary and grandma Brainard, by train the same day your Daddy and Mother left Mt. Pleasant for [?]. I find it a very lovely place, and the cottage comfortable with all sorts of conveniences. The lake is one mile inland from lake Mich. A chain of Cliffs separates this lake – which is 12x3 miles in size-from Lake Mich. Now I must close, I see I have made many mistakes which I hope you excuse.
