Dear Virginia:

We arrived home about 2:30 on Friday. The house wasn't as disorderly as feared because Mrs. Ran was there cleaning up. Mother and I both bought new hats in Minneapolis. We looked for cherry furniture and decided we won't be able to get any. Then to Richards Treat and home.

Today we all went to church except Mother who got the dinner. Wy was here for dinner. Then he and El went to the Air Show (May Foxes from South Dakota) and Charles and one of his friends went to the State Fair. Tuesday your mother and I will go to Winipeg and Charles will go to the University to straighten out his credits. They gave him credit for geography in place of sociology etc.

I think Eleanor has matured very much this summer and will perhaps be very much less a problem than heretofore. She and Wy scrap and criticize each other so much I sometimes wonder whether they are really suited one to another.

When we came away Friday morning we picked up along with the photographs a postal card belonging to you which I return because it should be answered.

Friday morning we reached the Wold Chamberlain Airport at 8:15 and found Dr. Lewis there alone. He looked just fine and we had a nice visit until his plane left a little later – a big 4 motor silvery ship.

We had another excellent crop on the North Dakota farm which will help us all out in good style.
